Mahā **Shivar**ā**tri** - **the night of the worship of Śri Śiva** - Mahā Shivarātri, the night of the worship of Śri Śiva, occurs on the 13th night/14th day of the new moon of the month of Phālguna or Māgha according to the Hindu calendar. Hindus celebrate this religious festival with great enthusiasm.

Numerous interesting and intriguing mythological stories are believed pertaining to the celebration to Mahā Shivarātri. Many believe that Mahā Shivarātri signifies the auspicious night when Śri Siva performed the dance 'Tāndava' that led to the creation, conservation and devastation of the universe.

The Festivity - Devotees observe a strict fast on this day. The Śiva Lingam is worshipped throughout the night by performing Abhishekam with milk, curd, honey, rose water, etc., whilst the chanting of the Mantra "Om Namah Shivaya" continues. Offerings of Bilva leaves to the Lingam are considered very sacred and dear to Śri Śiva. Join us and take part in the Maha Shivaratri Pūja rituals on **Monday 4th**, followed by Śri Śiva-Pārvathy Kalyānam on **Tuesday 5th** and obtain the blessings of Śri Śiva and Devi Pārvathy.
